Standard Day Trip

1. Ulaanbaatar City Tour

The city of Ulaanbaatar is the cultural and academic center of Mongolia. As commonly known as UB, the city is also home to the country's major art galleries, museums, educational institutions and a wide range of consumer services.

08:00 – 08:30 Meet your guide at hotel lobby.

08:30 – 09:15 Go to Gandan Monastery */Time depends on traffic/*

09:15 – 10:00 Visit Gandan Monastery, officially known as Gandantegchinlen, meaning "The Great Place of Complete Joy," is the spiritual center of Tibetan Buddhism in Mongolia. Originally established in the 19th century, it is one of the few monasteries to survive the communist purges of the 1930s and was fully restored after Mongolia's democratic revolution in 1990. Today, it remains an active monastery, home to over 150 monks. Its most iconic feature is the 26-meter-tall statue of Avalokitesvara (Migjid Janraisig), richly adorned with gold and semi-precious stones, symbolizing compassion. Visitors can witness monks in daily prayer rituals, explore temple complexes, and experience a living tradition of Mongolian Buddhism.



10:00 – 10:30 Go to National Museum of Mongolia */Time depends on traffic/*

10:30 – 12:00 Visit the National Museum of Mongolia offers a comprehensive journey through the country's rich and diverse history. Its well-curated exhibitions span from prehistoric times to the modern era, showcasing ancient tools, petroglyphs, traditional nomadic lifestyles, and Mongolia's imperial legacy under Chinggis Khan. One of the highlights is the stunning collection of traditional costumes representing various ethnic groups, illustrating the country's cultural diversity. The museum provides deep insights into the nation's archaeology, ethnography, and historical evolution—making it an essential stop for anyone seeking to understand Mongolia's unique identity.



12:00 – 12:15 Sukhbaatar Square which would cover the spot where Mongolia's independence was proclaimed in 1921.

12:15 – 13:15 Lunch at Mongolian restaurant.

13:15 – 14:00 Go to Bogd King Palace Museum. */Time depends on traffic/*

14:00 - 15:00 Visit to Bogd King Palace Museum, also known as the Winter Palace. This large complex of seven halls and a two-storey Russian style house was the winter home of Mongolia's last king and the third line in the Tibetan Buddhist hierarchy after the Dalai Lama and Panchen Lama.



15:00 – 15:15 Go to Buddha Statue in Buddha Park.

15:15 – 15:45 Visit Buddha Statue in Buddha Park.

16:00 – 17:00 Return to hotel. */Time depends on traffic/*

Mongolian Traditional Folk Concert (Optional):

Mongolian folklore concert in Ulaanbaatar is certainly one of the MUST-SEE attractions. Here you will see the Mongolian folk art such as small orchestra of Mongolian musical instruments, traditional long song, throat singing – KHOOMII, amazing art of contortion, Buddhist TSAM dance and much more.

2. Chinggis Khaan Statue Complex & Terelj National Park

Just an hour's drive northeast of Ulaanbaatar lies Gorkhi-Terelj National Park, a beloved escape into Mongolia's wild beauty. The park is famed for its dramatic granite rock formations, lush larch forests, wide open meadows, and crystal-clear rivers. Along the way, you'll visit the iconic Chinggis Khaan Statue Complex—home to the world's largest equestrian statue—where history and grandeur meet against the backdrop of the endless steppe. Terelj offers a perfect balance of natural serenity and cultural richness, making it a must-see destination near the capital.

08:45 – 09:00 Meet your guide at hotel lobby.

09:00 – 10:00 Go to Chinggis Khaan Statue Complex */Time depends on traffic/*

10:00 – 11:00 Visit Chinggis Khaan Statue Complex located about 54 kilometers east of Ulaanbaatar, the Chinggis Khaan Statue Complex is one of Mongolia's most iconic landmarks. Towering at 40 meters high, it is the largest equestrian statue in the world and depicts Chinggis Khaan holding a golden whip atop his horse, symbolizing power and unity. Visitors can take an elevator and stairway up to the horse's head for breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding steppe. Inside the base, you'll find a museum showcasing Mongol history and artifacts from the Great Khan's era, along with traditional costumes and exhibits about the nomadic lifestyle. The complex is a striking tribute to Mongolia's legendary leader and a must-see for anyone interested in the country's rich past.



11:00 – 11:30 Go to Terelj National Park */Time depends on traffic/*

11:30 – 12:45 Experience authentic Mongolian hospitality as you visit a local nomadic family in their traditional ger. Learn about their daily life, customs, and herding traditions. Then, enjoy a one-hour guided horseback ride through the scenic valleys of Terelj National Park—an unforgettable way to connect with Mongolia's natural beauty and nomadic heritage.



13:00 – 14:00 Lunch at Ger camp.

14:00 – 15:00 Visit Turtle Rock and take pictures of great scene.

15:00 – 16:30 Light hiking to Aryabala temple. Enjoy a peaceful and scenic hike to Terej National Park. The trail offers beautiful panoramic views, with prayer wheels and Buddhist teachings lining the path. This short yet meaningful walk leads to a serene temple perched on a hilltop, perfect for reflection and nature appreciation.



16:30 – 18:00 Return to hotel. */Time depends on traffic/*

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3. Mongol Nomadic Live Show

This tour offers a unique opportunity to experience the traditional Mongolian nomadic lifestyle firsthand. Watch how nomads set up and dismantle a ger, process wool into felt, and demonstrate centuries-old herding practices. Discover how the constant search for fresh pastures and water has

shaped a deeply rooted, mobile culture that remains an integral part of Mongolia's living heritage. It's an unforgettable journey into a way of life unlike any other in the world.

08:30 – 08:45 Meet your guide at hotel lobby.

08:45 – 10:00 Go to Mongol Nomadic camp */Time depends on traffic/*

10:00 – 12:00 Watch Mongol Nomadic Live show, the performance includes the relocation of a nomadic family—disassembling and reassembling a traditional ger (yurt), using yak and ox carts, and showcasing how felt is made from sheep wool. You'll also see how nomads prepare dairy products, wear their seasonal clothing, and herd their animals in harmony with nature. This interactive experience reveals the ingenuity and adaptability of Mongolia's nomads, offering visitors a deeper appreciation of their symbiotic relationship with the land, livestock, and seasons.



12:15 – 13:15 Lunch at Mongol Nomadic tourist camp

13:15 – 15:30 Return to hotel. */Time depends on traffic/*

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4. Khustai National Park

Located about 100 kilometers west of Ulaanbaatar, Khustai National Park is a protected area known for its successful reintroduction of the Przewalski's horse, or Takhi—the world's last truly wild horse. These rare and resilient animals once vanished from the wild but now roam freely across the park's vast grasslands thanks to dedicated conservation efforts.

The park's rolling steppe landscape is not only home to the Takhi but also supports a rich variety of wildlife including red deer, marmots, foxes, and numerous bird species. Visitors can explore the park through scenic hikes or guided horse rides, offering a peaceful retreat into Mongolia's natural beauty and a chance to witness unique wildlife in its native habitat.

08:45 – 09:00 Meet your guide at hotel lobby.

09:00 – 10:30 Go to Khustai National Park */Time depends on traffic/*

10:30 – 11:15 Visit the Khustai National Park Museum and watch an introductory video exhibition to learn about the park's history, wildlife, and the conservation efforts behind the reintroduction of the Przewalski's horse (Takhi).



11:15 – 13:30 Visit the Khustai National Park, drive deeper into the park to search for the Przewalski's horse (Takhi) in the wild. With the guidance of a park ranger or local guide, explore the steppe landscape where these rare horses graze in small herds. Along the way, keep an eye out for other wildlife such as red deer, marmots, and various bird species. A short nature hike or scenic stop may be included to enhance the experience.



13:30 – 14:30 Lunch at nearby camp.

14:30 – 16:30 Return to hotel. /Time depends on traffic/

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5. The beauty of the Gobi Desert – 4 days

Day 1 South Gobi / Bayanzag Flaming Cliffs 55 km + 100 km

Check out from your hotel in Ulaanbaatar and transfer to the airport for your flight to Dalanzadgad, departing at 03:00 and arriving at 04:00. Upon arrival in Dalanzadgad, you will be greeted and transferred travel to Bayanzag, famously known as the Flaming Cliffs for 100 km. Check in, settle into your traditional accommodation, and enjoy breakfast surrounded by the vast Gobi Desert landscape. This striking landscape of red sandstone formations earned its name from the fiery glow it emits at sunrise and sunset. The cliffs are also renowned for the significant dinosaur fossil discoveries made here, including rare eggs and bones. Exploring the dramatic terrain, walking among the ancient rock formations, and learning about the area's fascinating paleontological history. Capture stunning photos of the vibrant cliffs against the clear desert sky. In the evening, return to your ger camp for a relaxing dinner and overnight stay.



Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are included.

Day 2 South Gobi / Khongoryn Els 200 km

Breakfast at the ger camp and travel approximately 200 km to Khongoryn Els, the famous “Singing Dunes.” Upon arrival, check into your ger camp and enjoy an afternoon camel ride through the stunning sand dunes, experiencing the traditional desert nomadic way of life. Relax in the evening with dinner under the vast Gobi sky.



Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are included.

Day 3 South Gobi/ Yoliin Am 200 km

After breakfast, drive to Yoliin am for 200 km and check in ger camp. After lunch explore the breathtaking Yol Valley with its dramatic cliffs and icy river and enjoy soft trekking. End your day with stargazing under the clear desert sky.

Day 4 Fly to Ulaanbaatar 45 km + 55 km

Check out your gee camp at midnight and you will drive approximately 45 km to the airport in time for your flight departing at 04:40 and arriving in Ulaanbaatar at 05:45. Upon arrival, you will be transferred to your hotel in the city, concluding your memorable Gobi Desert adventure.
